When to report an injury to OSHA:

- All employees are required to notify OSHA when an employee is killed on the job or suffers a work-related hospitalization, amputation, or loss of an eye
- A fatality must be reported within 8 hours
- An in-patient hospitalization, amputation, or eye loss must be reported within 24 hours
